Some reflections for the fourth week of Lent

As we enter the season of Lent and we reflect on the sufferings of Christ, our hearts also respond to the suffering of others in our community. At Lutheran Community Care the demands on our welfare services continue to increase at an alarming rate.

John 3:16-21

'For God loved the world so much that he gave his one and only Son, so that everyone who believes in him will not perish but have eternal life. God sent his Son into the world not to judge the world, but to save the world through him.

There is not judgement against anyone who believes in him. But anyone who does not believe in him has already been judged for not believing in God's one and only Son. And the judgement is based on this fact: God's light came into the world, but people loved the darkness more than the light, for their actions were evil. All who do evil hate the light and refuse to go near it for fear their sins will be exposed. But those who do what is right come to the light so others can see that they are doing what God wants.'

Those of us living in large western cities rarely experience 'pitch darkness' like those living in remote communities in Australia and around the world. When we have our eyes open and we are in total darkness we can feel disorientated and afraid. We wait for just a glimmer of light to orient us again and to assure us that we are safe.

The gospel of John often uses the image of light and darkness to help us understand the self giving love of God who wants to comfort us in our darkness and bring us light. God went through the darkness of Jesus' death to bring light to the world. We can hold onto that light to orient us when things seem dark in our world and we can be that light for others when they are going through dark times. Our sense of being in darkness is not only caused by the physical absence of light. Psychological and emotional turmoil, mental or physical illness, grief and loss and our inability to cope with what life throws at us can plunge us into depression and hopelessness that can feel like a black hole. When this happens it is very hard to see even the pinpoints of light that others try to shine. When it happens to someone in our family, our workplace or our community, we often don't know how to bring any light to the situation and our well meaning cheeriness can sometimes make matters worse.

Staff at Lutheran Community Care often encounter people experiencing a time of darkness and they work carefully to listen and respond to their needs. Often there are multiple needs as those who are not coping emotionally cannot face the practical demands of life, such as buying food and paying bills. In the work they do the staff are inspired by God's love which brings light and freedom from fear. Over many years LCC has also provided support to individuals wanting to learn how to respond appropriately to those who may be going through dark times. Your contribution to Food Parcels+ enables those in the community to learn new skills and allows our staff to meet the physical, emotional and spiritual needs of those who come to us for support.

Praying

Repent of times you have talked against God's designated authority. Pray for those in authority. Thank God that in Jesus we see him face to face, and know his form. Rejoice that in Jesus you are forgiven. Pray for each other.

Verse for the Week

"With him I speak face to face, clearly and not in riddles; he sees the form of the LORD." Numbers 12:8

Character Conversation Questions

How have I treated those in authority? Have I given Jesus time for prayer? What have I done to rest this week? Have I loved my spouse, parents, family, friends?

How have I loved people? What's driving my morality? How have I used God's gifts to me? Have I told the truth?

Has the green monster of envy reared it's head this week?

Am I seeking Jesus' face, to live his shape? Where did I encounter Jesus this week? Did I finish my reading and hear from God? What am I going to do? Have I been honest with myself?
