

Part 7. Deep & Wide Book Review – by Andy Stanley

For nearly two thousand years, churches have taken their marching orders from one command Jesus left with his followers the afternoon he made his farewell address & returned to the Father '*Make Disciples*' While we don't dispute the importance of that command, there has certainly been a lot of discussion around what it means & how to pull it off.

Andy shares what it means to create Jesus followers or as he sometimes refers to it as their *spiritual formation model*, this is their take on how individuals mature in their faith.

How they ensure that new believers, as well as seasoned believers, continue to mature in their faith. What does Andy Stanley's North Point Ministry's discipleship model look like?

It is not a program, a curriculum or a series of classes. Andy doesn't believe classes create mature believers. Classes create smart believers, but that's different. Theological education is something that can be explored separately.

What should our discipleship model look like? What is our goal for the people who choose to partner with us in ministry? What does a mature believer look like? What role does the church have in developing Christ followers?

North Points mission statement is; *to lead people into a growing relationship with Jesus Christ*. They determined that *faith* is what grows in a growing relationship

Christianity is an invitation to re-enter a relationship of trust with the Father. At the cross sin was forgiven and we were invited to trust. It makes perfect sense that salvation comes by faith, not obedience. Intimate relationships are not built on obedience. They are built on trust. Walking by faith, is simply living as if God is who he says he is & that he will do everything he has promised to do. As a person's confidence in God grows, he or she ma-

tures.


What grows people's faith? Andy identified 5 things that showed up in everybody's faith story & developed a ministry model that continuality pointed people back to these 5 dynamics. The 5 Faith Catalysts: Practical Teaching, Private Disciplines, Personal Ministry, Providential Relationships, Pivotal Circumstances. More next week.
