Part 10. Deep & Wide Book Review – by Andy Stanley

(Next meeting Monday 24th Sept 7pm - Ed Cen)

The final two faith catalysts of the five catalysts in growing faith that Andy has identified are providential relationships and pivotal circumstances. Andy groups these together because, unlike the other three, they have found they have little control over them. Even so, every faith story Andy's heard has included these two.

Catalyst #4: Providential Relationships.

When people tell their stories, they always talk about the individuals they believe God put in their paths. We call them "providential" because people are convinced that God brought those people into their lives. There are usually two key factors involved: when we hear from God through someone and when we see God in someone. When either of those happens, our faith grows. But here's the problem—you can't program these. What we can do is create environments that are conducive to the development of these types of relationships. That shaped Andy's approach to both family ministry and adult small groups. They use closed rather than open groups for their small group ministry. Their groups stay together for two years, which they believe helps facilitate authentic community. On the family side, their commitment to create environments conducive to providential relationships caused them to make several key decisions. Foremost was their decision to keep group leaders with their small groups as long as possible. The longer a group leader was with a group of kids, the more likely that a relationship would develop—and the more likely God could use a group leader in a significant way in their lives. Even their Starting Point Ministry is done as a small group (size limit of 12). They've found that the relationships developed there are just as valuable as the content they provide.

Catalyst #5: Pivotal Circumstances.

When people tell their faith stories, they always include events that could be described as "defining moments." Some of these are good, positive events or experiences, and sometimes, just as often, they involve pain or disappointment. Either way, life has the potential to impact faith for good or bad. The problem here is there is no way to program a pivotal circumstance! The key issue isn't so much what the circumstance is, as much as how it is interpreted. Some people will fall away from their faith after experiencing hardships or loss, while many others experience great suffering and do not lose their faith; how they interpret what they see makes all the difference. So, what determines how we interpret events? Andy landed on two things: our worldviews, and who we are doing life with at the time. Understanding that, they work hard to help people develop a biblical worldview, so they can maintain faith regardless of what comes their way, and they have developed an approach to ministry that is highly relational. So those are Andy's five faith catalysts. Andy is convinced that God uses these dynamics to grow our faith. He believes that these dynamics are at work whether we are aware of them or not. He also believes something powerful happens when we look for ways to leverage these catalysts. What are your views toward this model for spiritual formation?


