A STICK AND ATTITUDE

As a member of Rural Youth (many years ago), we had a fellow Rural Youth member stay on our farm for a weekend. He was completely blind, did not have a guide dog and relied on his blind man's cane and his trust in people to guide him. When I asked how to help him best, his reply was, "let me hold your arm and slowly walk me at my pace around your house, house yard and farmyard while describing where we are." We went on the tour, and at the end, he said, "Thanks. I think I'll be OK now." He wandered alone for the remainder of his time with us, and I never saw him stumble or appear disoriented.

That weekend was a lesson in trust, and that trust, coupled with the ability to use learned awareness skills, leading to the freedom to wander a new environment.

Every day we head into life not knowing what will happen, often pushing aside the help offered by someone who knows what is ahead through every moment of the day. He not only knows what is ahead, but he promises to love you throughout every day, twenty-four, seven, three hundred and sixty-five to forever.

My friend trusted, listened to my descriptions and warnings as we walked and learned where the obstacles were.

Jesus said, "My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me." - (John 10:27)

Are you prepared to consider the Jesus of the Bible as a friend who cares, loves and only wants what is good for you, desires that you have a life filled with joy?

Are you prepared to be humble and admit you need him to show you where the stumbling blocks may be in your life and help you find ways around them? When you do stumble, are you willing to accept the help called "forgiveness" he offers?

Most importantly, will you listen when he says, "I love you with a love that took me to a death on a cross"? Tell him your answer. He's listening.



Based on John 17:24 "I want you to be with me"

MEN'S BREAKFAST 21st June 2022 (submitted by Matt Woidt)

Twenty-six men (and 4 local shearing crew passing through) enjoyed a beautiful sunrise, warming fire and bush breaky of bacon, eggs, mushys, tomatoes, cereal, juice, tea and coffee amongst the mallee trees and hay bales of a Monteith bush block. (we were very grateful to be able to meet there.)

We were blessed by a great opening devotion, table Grace, warm up exercise session and 26 men joining in the song "This is the Day the Lord has Made", led by Graham Schubert. This was absolutely powerful.

During breakfast, a few guys chipped in to assemble our cross for the journey across the paddock.

After the awesome breaky we were treated to a great, thought-provoking message/discussion/prayer time by Pastor Paul, about "bearing our † cross." Based on Matthew 10:37-42.

What does this mean to you?? How do you perceive this? Think about it.

Some brief key thoughts and messages that came from this through our open sharing:

1. The symbol of the cross is recognised world-wide, by not just Christians; 2. When things are not going well, anxious, scared, sick or struggling, focus on the power and meaning of the cross. The saving power of the cross and the sacrifice of Jesus and the defeat of death and the devil is our main significance, so we live free. 7. The cross is life for us.

After the message and sharing time, we warmed up again and embarked on the journey bearing our cross - literally!!! We all chimed in as a team and carried the heavy wooden cross about 200m across the up and down ground to a patch of trees facing the Princes Highway. We worked as team, erected the cross in a pre-dug (not very deep) limestone hole. (I'd forgotten what it was like digging holes in mallee sheet rock - the childhood memories) To see the guys getting involved was awesome.

Once it was standing high in the morning sun, a few guys shared how they felt carrying the cross - remembering Jesus journey with it, his pain, suffering, the splinters, crown of thorns, weather conditions, crowd scoffing, the weight, the torture etc on trek to Golgotha.

Earlier, we had each been given a card to write our name, our sins, problems, anxieties, thanks and praises on. We took turns nailing them to the cross standing before us. Powerful stuff. How good is this? The feeling of freedom and life.

This cross can be seen from the highway if you're driving past.

We trekked back to the breaky site for good byes and pack up time.

Highlights of this men's breakfast gathering - the beautiful, clear, crisp sunrise; many blokes pitching in to

help out in some way; Pastor Paul greeting the guys at the entry gate on arrival (this was significant); The fellowship of a meal, building relationships and open sharing; carrying the cross.
