

STEPPING OUT IN FAITH

We were on holidays in Queensland when we noted a request from Velma Zerk, in the CommUnity Chatter for accommodation assistance for 2 trainee nurses doing their placement at Murray Bridge Hospital

We have a family home with a spare room with an ensuite. In the past we have provided accommodation for members of the Kiaros ministry team during their short course study week at Mobilong Prison. God has blessed us during their stays with us and we have been able to learn more about how God is working in their lives and in the prison ministry.

<u>2 Student Nurses</u> - that is all we knew when we said we would have them stay with us for the 3 weeks In faith we knew God would lead and guide us as the 2 students came to join us. It was a big step in faith for them as well, as in their home country they do not step foot in a stranger's home. Having us in the past, both worked in the medical field and at Murray Bridge Hospital, we assured them that we understood what shift work was all about.

After the first day they were one of our family. Such delightful, loving young ladies!

Both girls were born in Nepal and are on a study visa to work in Australia.

They were not paid for the 3 weeks while they were here, so to supplement their incomes they work in aged care and disability care, generally having only one day off per fortnight while on placement.

We made a commitment that we would take them to work before 7am for the early shift and would bring them back at 9.30pm, after the late shift - not wanting them to be walking in the rain, cold or the dark streets of Murray Bridge.

We gave them the run of the kitchen. They provided all their own meals and cooked for us on many occasions. Beautiful Nepalese cuisine!

We had farm visits with both, experiencing sheep shearing for the first time, big tractors and many walking tracks. They enjoyed walking the wetlands and finding native orchids at Monarto.





We have learned a lot about their families in Nepal, their life as students in Australia including the strict rules and difficulties with visas to enable them to study and work in Australia.

During the 3 weeks we met some of their extended family members as well. A great hard-working bunch of dedicated workers, all willing to make Australia their home.

On their last evening with us we visited with Velma & Roy Zerk and enjoyed a lovely meal at the Chinese Restaurant.

We thank the Lord for bringing these young ladies into our lives and pray that they will be able to finish their Enrolled Nurse course and be able to extend their Visa to work here in Australia.
