If "Good News" is shared and celebrated with joy, it spreads and impacts the lives who come to join in the uplifting experiences and consequences.

For thousands of years, the "Good News" of God's love for all people has been going around the world and impacting lives, whole communities, and even countries. Yet in these latter years, that "Good News" of God's love, shown through the death and coming alive again of His Son Jesus, appears to have less of an impact on lives.

Why?

Could it be that those of us who call ourselves followers of Jesus (Christians) no longer show enthusiasm about the love of God?

Have we been lulled into thinking that "clever" answers and explanations to "life problems" are more able to bring joy and understanding than the words of a God of love? A God who, through his never-ending love and wisdom, has only ever said, "All I ever do is for your good." (Romans 8:28)

Does my life show the joy, the excitement of knowing the love of a God who only ever wants what is best for me and all people? Will my life excite others to "give it a go"? Everyone in the group took a Pepino cutting home to grow; such was the gardener's enthusiasm.

Talk to God about growing him, helping your enthusiasm and excitement grow.

Reformation



Kairos is a ministry of passing on God's love to prison inmates and officials. You are invited to be part of this ministry by sharing in any of the following

Prayer is the foundation of the whole Kairos ministry. Your prayers leading up to and during the Prison Ministry training are greatly appreciated. Please pray for: God to prepare the inmates who will be invited to the program; The team leaders and preparation of their team; The receptiveness of the inmates (our guests) who participate in the program; The smooth running of the program, and for the success of fundraising. An 80-hour international prayer vigil covers the duration of the program. The prayer vigil is divided into ½ hour time slots and extends from 12pm on Tuesday 22nd Nov to 8pm on Friday 25th November 2022. . POSTERS and PLACEMATS

These put a name and face to the Body of Christ, please make a poster and/or placemat which will be displayed during the Kairos program. Posters should convey greetings from the maker(s) to "The men of Kairos Mobilong (or similar), and express the love and hope found in Christ, or a short Bible verse. Placemats — use A4 paper / coloured paper which will be used during mealtimes. Please use only your own pictures and words. Nothing is to be pasted onto the sheet including glitter and stickers. The Agape team will laminate these as they are received. No identification or age.

During the Kairos program, each guest will be given a bundle of short and encouraging letters, from people **over 16** years old

- Addressed "Dear friend" and express the assurance of God's love for the person, and of the writer's prayers for them. It can be helpful to write about the forgiving nature of God, and to include personal examples of receiving forgiveness.
- Letters must be hand-written and each one unique and be placed unfolded in a plastic sleeve, with an envelope, but not inside the envelope. **Please do not use your address**

Here is the opportunity for you to make tangible, visible (and edible) **expressions of the love of your Christian community** for the guests and team members on this Short Course.

As these expressions of love will be going inside Mobilong, the following guidelines apply:

- Freshly handmade biscuits or slices, both savoury and sweet, and not shop bought
- Slices requiring no refrigeration.
- A variety of biscuits. Decorated biscuits are particularly sought after all edible decorations may be used, dried fruits may be used, try to avoid Anzac biscuits
- Biscuits may be iced, but must not be sprinkled with, or rolled in icing sugar and NO NUTS
- Vegemite may **not** be used as an ingredient.
