JOHN 20: 19-31: The first section of this reading deals with a post-resurrection commissioning of the disciples together with the gift of the Holy Spirit. The disciples are herewith empowered (as with Matthew 16) to impart or withhold the forgiveness of sins which the Lord has now made an accomplished fact by his death and resurrection. Hence Thomas's unreadiness to believe the fact of the resurrection is strongly reproved but graciously remedied by the risen Lord. The spiritual blessings which God gives so readily are not received except through humble faith. Indeed, 'Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed'.

ACTS 4:32-35: In those very early days of the church in Jerusalem the tremendous surge of vitality empowered by the coming of the Holy Spirit was coupled with the result of so many believers having witnessed the presence of the bodily risen Jesus (1 Cor 15:6). Their conviction engendered a deep sense of love for others which transcended their love and attachment to things material.

PRAYER: Risen Christ, You live again with Your scars. You come before us with the words, "Peace be with you." You embody healing and hope. You accept us with our wounds from the world, our scars that still haven't healed quite right, our questions and our doubts. You call us to follow. Help us to accept the invitation: help us to accept that we don't have to be perfect, that we will never have it all straightened out, that we will always be a bit of a mess, and that You love us exactly as we are. Amen

PEACE

At 6.45 am, Easter Sunday, the small Bookpurnong Lutheran Church members and assorted families and friends started gathering on the bank of the Gurra Gurra Creek in the Riverland of South Australia to celebrate this annual celebration of faith and friendship.

The morning was one of those for which The Riverland is renowned: calm, the merest hint of a breeze, postcard picture sunrise, and a flock of pelicans paddling past, nodding in agreement, "Yes! It's a great morning to be alive!".

With the worship service starting, it felt as if no one would have been surprised to see Jesus come wandering along the edge of the water, stop, light a fire and start cooking some fish to share with us, and offer the unique "Peace" he offered to all he met in his travels around the now war-torn Middle East.

As we, few in numbers, sang and prayed under that tin shelter, I thought about Jesus, the Son of God, and how he brought peace, healing and forgiveness to people, seldom in grand cathedral-like edifices, but as and where he met them. People like the blind beggar sitting in the dirt and crying out for help (JOHN 9:1-12), despised, shunned and cast aside leppers in their rags (LUKE 17:11-19), a deaf mute (MARK 7:31-35), a Roman Centurian's servant, (MATTHEW 8:5-13) a paralytic man brought to Jesus by friends and left carrying his stretcher (MATTHEW 9:1-8), and healed the daughter of a church leader who everyone thought was dead. (MARK 5:21:-24, 35-42)

Jesus still comes to where his offer of peace and love is needed; it has nothing to do with grand and glorious buildings with stained glass windows, fine, respectable locations, or well-dressed crowds of people. This same Jesus, son of the loving God, continues to offer his presence and peace. He offers it in the dirt and slums of wind-blown city streets and to the lonely, struggling single parent and her children in their cramped two-room flat. He comes to the lonely and unemployed figure huddled under a blanket in a parkland or under a bridge and, always in love, calls us to accept his offer of peace.

He hears our cries for peace and delivers no matter who we are or where we might be. He might do this directly by His Spirit bringing inner peace to you or through the actions of another obeying his call to love and care as he did for them.

May the peace offered by Jesus be in your life and always with you as promised.

CREATIVE RESPONSE

There is a long history of Christians sharing a sign of peace with one another in public worship as a physical expression of the peace God gives to us through Jesus. It connects directly to Jesus' greeting his disciples in the resurrection. That public greeting also extended to personal greetings.

Romans 16:16 refers to Christians greeting each other with a "holy kiss."

Decide with others on a sign of peace that you can share together in daily life, such as a special handshake, hug, or kiss.

As you share this sign bless each other by saying, "The peace of the Lord Jesus be with you."



ACTION RESPONSE

Acts 4:32-35 says that the first followers of Jesus shared their belongings with one another and made sure that no fellow Christians were in need. The power of the resurrection had changed their understanding of what they owned and how they cared for each other. This response is a confession of faith and a commitment to love your neighbour as yourself. Consider everything you own as a loan from God to love others. How might that influence your actions today?
