Nightly, the newscasts demonstrate this phenomenon as our TV screens fill with images of "Followers" thrusting placards or flags towards the sky while bellowing and repeating the thoughtless obscenities of someone with a megaphone, with little regard for "why", "reason", or "understanding". Once, one took the time to learn about the leader and find out where they were leading you. The emphasis now appears to be on "following", even if it leads to a confrontation with the elected law and negligent, willful destruction.

A little over two thousand years ago, a bloke called Jesus called to twelve men, "Come, follow me, and I will show you how to fish for people (Matthew 4:19). He also listed his credentials to lead with the words, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me." (John 14:6). And what was to be the outcome of "following"? A friendship with the God of love who guaranteed a spirit which brought to life love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against these things there is no law."
