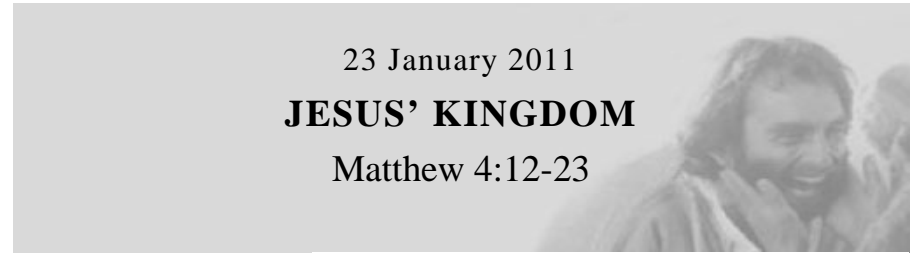

JESUS' KINGDOM

Matthew 4:12-23

No matter what he did, he couldn't make himself part of the royal family. So no matter what he did he couldn't become a citizen of heaven.

You could feast at the family dinner table. You could join in with the family Christmas celebrations. You could enjoy being a loved,

And it certainly is important being a legal citizen. What happens to those who stay in Australia illegally? They're caught and deported. They have no right to stay, to be part of this country and all that it offers. Citizenship is important, for then you are part of the country, and then you can enjoy living in the country with all it has to offer.

Jesus comes born our brother that we might be re-born the Heavenly Father's children.

In the gospel reading we get the image of two kingdoms, the kingdom of light and the kingdom of dark. "The people living in the darkness have seen a great light; those living in the land of the

shadow of death, a light has dawned." (Matt. 4:16/Isa. 9:2)

I don't know about you, but I certainly don't want to spend my life in the 'land of the shadow of death'. What a horrid image. Existing under the shadow of death, sapping the life out of everything. It

comes to nothing, at best. It's a slow decay, where fading memories reign. A land where your best is never good enough, you could always have done more. If only you could have the time again, but you can't. Slowly but surely everything is being taken from you; losing your vibrancy for life, losing your sharp mind, losing your senses, as they become dull. The 'land of the shadow of death' is a horrid kingdom, where anger

and fear and intimidation rule.

Thank God that Jesus came proclaiming the Kingdom of Heaven.

Thank God we now can live in his kingdom of light, with Jesus as King.

As citizens of heaven we're not left in the dark. We're not thrown into the storms of life; sink or swim as best you can. Inevitable we all run out of strength and sink.

Not so in the kingdom of heaven, for there we swim based on our kings strength. And his strength doesn't run out, rather we have the hope of the opposite. We have in Jesus the hope of resurrection, our best, by far, is yet to come.

In Jesus we are citizens of heaven. We now have the wonderful privilege and opportunity to live

under his grace and mercy, under his sacrificial love. We're not ruled by what we fear, for Jesus' perfect love drives out all fear. We are now infused with Jesus' spirit, and have the strength to live out his sacrificial love. The kingdom of heaven is characterised by; love one another, serve one another, forgive one another, carry one another's burdens, not judging one another but encouraging one another.

In Jesus there is no room thankfully for selfishness, for self-centred, small, insecure lives. Thank God that in Jesus our lives become participation in his sacrificial love, where he is at the centre, and in Jesus all things are possible. In Jesus' kingdom we live from what we have, as we live from the security of knowing our Father is overjoyed with his children,

passionately wanting to invest himself in us.

Once upon a time there was a young man, who couldn't earn the right to become a citizen of heaven, but much to his surprise the Heavenly Father, adopted him as his son, at the cost of his One and Only Son. Now he was re-born a

child of the royal family, a legitimate citizen of heaven.

Now he had the exciting future of growing up as one of the Father's children. Of listening to the Father, learning to speak his native tongue, just like his heavenly Father. Of watching his Father, and mimicking everything he saw, till it came naturally. Naturally because as his Father's child they now share the same

DNA. As the young man developed you could see the family resemblance, you could see the proud smile on his Father's face. Especially as his children played well together.

What a great privilege we have of living as citizens of heaven, of living with Jesus as our king. Wonderfully through our baptism we have been re-born in Jesus, and are now the

Father's children. We are now children of the royal family, legal heirs, legal citizens who have all the rights, privileges and responsibilities that go with being a citizen of heaven. We have the wonderful privilege of growing up with Dad, our heavenly Father, of playing together in garden with our big brother Jesus.
