whole. As we walk with God, listening to him, open to his promises, knowing his personality we discover ourselves, so that we can grow in living true to who we are no matter the circumstance.

In Jesus we are no longer determined by our circumstances. We don't have to continually prove ourselves, bouncing around like a pinball. In Jesus is inviting you to Jesus we grow mature, shaping life to Jesus' pattern, and not being moulded by our circumstances. In Jesus, sexuality, yourself. whether our circumstances are good, Jesus is saving; 'Trust bad or ugly we remain the same; and live from that you might discover the trust Jesus has birthed in us. We live from the relationship Jesus has invited us into; and enjoy watching Jesus live true

for us to be; healed and to who he is, in every situation.

> Today Jesus is seeking to prove your faith, as he invites you to walk with him, following him, growing in your relationship with him, because he can be trusted. Jesus has sacrificed himself for us, that we might know Father's love. That we might have Spirit with us now; walking together into every situation of life. Genesis 22:1-14

Today we encounter Abraham having to face up to? maybe the greatest challenge of his life; God asks him to sacrifice his son!

What would be going through your mind if God asked you to kill someone vou loved to prove your trust in him? first thought that came I'd be wondering who this God character is. Why does he want me to prove myself to him? exam. Where is the Have I missed something? What is God up to, it doesn't make sense? They'd be some of the thoughts running through my mind.

On reading this story I'm also a bit confused because I know that one question of the quality of the things God says he hated about the people originally living faith genuine? I've in Canaan was that they noticed that the first had child sacrifice. Why is God asking Abraham to sacrifice Isaac? I'm repulsed by

the idea. What is God

We begin this story with this phrase: "Some it is Ok, but if they time later. God tested Abraham's faith." (Gen. 22:1)

When you heard that phrase what was the to your mind? The first thought I got was that of having to pass an focus if this is an exam I have to pass? It's on me!

Have you noticed that when talking about faith people inevitably focus on the person who is meant to have faith? Then it is a of their faith? Do I have lives to being enough faith? Is my thought of most people when talking about faith is that they focus on 'their' faith. They focus on themselves,

their ability to accept. giving their ascent to what they hear; like if they agree with it then don't agree with it, then it isn't important.

When you hear the word 'faith' what is the first thing that comes to your mind? If it is vourself, or in this instance, Abraham, maybe we're looking in the wrong direction.

You might be surprised. but it isn't the quality or quantity of your faith that counts. I've run across plenty of people with amazing faith, it shaped their life; they'd only buy a Holden, they wouldn't talk to certain people, they gave their successful. I've encountered many people with amazing faith; but they'd put their trust in the wrong thing.

I can be completely committed to believing that the world is flat. I could commit my life to test, you don't pass. the cause. I could spend You're not good all my time and effort in trying to convince other people, the world is flat. I could be 100% committed to believing the world is flat. Would God to me. This that make the world flat? If I asked you to sacrifice your son to prove your belief that the world is flat, would that make the world flat? Of course not.

I've always understood this story as Abraham proving himself to God. about testing My focus was on Abraham and what he did. Abraham has to prove himself to God.

If that is the story what does that say about you and God: for Abraham is an example of faith. Does this mean God is testing you, having you prove to him how committed you are? And what is the inference if you fail the test? You fail. You're a Abraham. You can trust again to be trustworthy. failure!

You fail, means you're not good enough for God. You failed the enough; you didn't kill your son to prove vourself.

This doesn't sound like News, because definitely doesn't sound me. God walks with like Jesus to me.

It isn't the quality or quantity of your faith that counts.

Maybe this story isn't Abraham's faith. Maybe this story is about proving to Abraham that this God he has been following can be trusted, at all times, even when things because God always don't make sense. This God of promise can always be trusted, for he always does what he promises.

This is a story of God proving himself to this God with your son, for he is totally trustworthy. You can

trust God with your son. he will always keep his promises, for he is totally trustworthy.

The focus of this story is God. not Abraham. Which for me is Good Abraham is you and Abraham growing his trust in him, maturing

his trust in him, for God does come through. God does provide. He can be trusted to keep his word.

Notice that the emphasis is that God can be trusted to keep his word, not that I've proved myself to be worthy of God's love. Abraham isn't our father of faith because he was so perfect, but came through keeping his promise. So we too can trust this God. knowing he will come through keeping his promises.

God proves himself God has grown Abraham's trust in him by coming through for Abraham once again.

The devil will get you to believe you have to prove yourself. I always himself to Abraham. remember when I was a God grew their boy there was a man at relationship to a deeper church who had lost his level of trust. Abraham hand. My father shared has experienced with me how this man had taken an ax, and to prove his faith in God, slammed it down on his hand. What did that prove?
