he's said so, and Jesus is the WORD.

Sin is the condition of existing not knowing vou're loved. worthwhile, wanted. and spending your life trving to win this love. worth and approval. Outside of Jesus vou'll always come up empty. That's the horror of sin: knowing love is essential. striving to gain it in our own power, but coming up empty.

In Jesus we know we are loved, for Father has declared us his child. In Jesus we know we are accepted, wanted. valued, for Jesus has given his life for us on the cross. Not might but has, so that in Jesus this is our new reality. In Jesus we don't come up empty, but we grow into him, we grow to be true to this wonderful new

nature we have. We don't come up empty but embraced by our loving Father, living loved for no other reason than that's who we are, that who you

Sin is horrific: not knowing your worth. not feeling loved. death robbing hope. age stealing your abilities, other people's insecurities destroying you. Sin is horrific. If it was only the bad things we do, then all we'd have to do is not do them. But it is so, so, much more insidious and destructive.

In Jesus, you now live a new life. In Jesus. vou are a new creation. In Jesus vou are Father's favoured child, whom he loves and delights to live with. In Jesus, vou are invited to feast at

Father's table and rejoice in life together.

It's not about the 'good things', however you what to define that. It is about the new life we have to live. It is about living true to who we are: for Father has declared you. in Jesus, his child, and that is what you are.

What's the first thing that comes to your mind when you hear the word 'Sin'?

> church what sin meant they would point to people's bad actions. So I've had a guy tell me that God would like him because

he was a good guy. And he was. I enjoyed his company. He was incredibly generous. He became a lawyer and other good causes.

So if sin was the bad things you did, you'd sav most of his life wasn't sin? What is meant by this word 'sin'?

If you steal you're a sinner, which would mean if you don't steal you're not a sinner. Of course you'd have to

define stealing. Is me having a coffee in the office each morning and not paying for it stealing? I'm taking something that isn't mine. that I haven't paid for, so why wouldn't that be classified as stealing?

Now you can see how the Pharisees of Jesus' day got themselves all tied up in knots. They re-classified sin as the bad things we do. using the Ten Commandments as the measuring rod for what is good.

That almost sound riaht!

Just one problem. which Jesus highlighted in the way he dealt with their Sabbath rules. These men were earnest. that being earnest doesn't make you right? These men didn't want to sin, they often massage the didn't want to break the law, and the law said don't work on the do. Sabbath.

So they earnestly sought to do this, only they had to define work. Was walking a carrying a load. If you carried a load of 5 but was 20 kilograms working? Your body would have had to work harder.
