I think this is what Jesus is inviting each of us to do as we

follow him. Let go of our wealth and find life, security, identity, ourselves, in him. Wealth can be such a killer. for without thinking we let it determine who we are. how we see the cross, his final words: world, what we value as important, shaping hands I give my soul', our decision making.
