JESUS' PRAYER IN GETHSEMANE

Luke 22:39-46

I find Jesus' prayer recorded for us at Gethsemane, very short. I don't know about you but if I was fervently, and he was had offered Jesus facing hell itself I might have tried to twist Father's arm just a bit more. I might have let out a very long litany of complaint; it's unfair, they deserve it, why me. That's always a good one, why me: where often I'm implying I'm the good find it amazing that guy so get stuck into the bad guys.

All we have recorded are these few short words; "Father if you are willing, please take this cup of suffering away from me. Yet I want your will to be done, not mine." (Luke 22:42)

For me these words alone don't portray the agony that they were wrapped in. We're told; "an angel

from heaven appeared and strengthened Jesus. He prayed more in such agony of spirit that his sweat fell to the ground like great drops of blood." (Luke 22:42)

Obviously this isn't some casual conversation, but Jesus is pouring out his heart and soul. I Jesus needed an angel to come and strengthen him. What Where might the must have Jesus been going through. and not just for a moment. Three times Jesus goes and prays. And Jesus comment to Peter was, 'can't you watch willing', I'm more

Jesus was in this state for hours; a minute would have been too much for me. I'd have wanted to bail and find and easier alternative.

Remember the devil and easier alternative at the start of his ministry. All Jesus had to do was bow down and worship the devil and the world was his: no pain. I'm sure the devil was right there reminding Jesus; he did have options, an easy option, with no pain.

devil seek to tempt you with his options; his no pain options?

Lots of times, if I'm honest, I don't pray 'Father if you are and pray for an hour!' directive. Like, 'Get me out of here!' 'You need to fix this and now, don't you know what you're doing!'

Sometimes I'm tempted to question why Father isn't willing, because it looks so wrong to me and I can see a he agree with me? Sometimes I'm tempted to pray more He's not alone. like; 'Father if you can then why don't you, or aren't you up to it.' 'Do you hate me and want me to suffer.'

Jesus finds strength in this intimate relationship he shares with Father. Jesus finds strength better way. Why can't as Father personally embraces him through the angel. They're in this together. It is the love from me. Yet I want they share, that they live in, that has lead

Father not taking the pain from Jesus meant he would suffer horrifically too. They plunge into this pain together. They plunge into this pain; but it's not the pain that shapes them, it is their passion for those they love that shapes their action.

You could say that it is in the furnace of suffering and pain that love is made to shine all the brighter: is purified, is amplified.
