you might be growing in that wonderful relationship of love and affection he has created. Living true to vourself, because in Jesus, with Jesus. through Jesus more and more you can discover who you really are.

What freedom Jesus is inviting you to live in. Not controlled by other people's thoughts, or my fears of their thoughts. Not being callous to other people as I try to prove I'm not influenced by them. No in Jesus we have the wonderful freedom to live true to who we are in every situation. We have the wonderful privilege of shaping the world

forgiving grace, so that around us, and not being putty in it's hands.

> This week I again encourage you to share with Jesus the things you love; that vou love about life. about the people you know, about him. Romans 4:1-5,13-17
